

R.C.G.A. RULES SHALL GOVERN ALL PLAY

LOCAL RULES

1. Out of Bounds. Boundaries as defined by fences, including the cemetery fence, or lines of white stakes.
2. Staked trees are considered ground under repair and relief may be obtained under rule 25-1. (see procedures below under obstructions)
3. Paved surfaces and greenskeepers paths and roadways are considered obstructions and relief may be taken as follows:
 - (a) determine the **nearest** point of relief which
 - (i) is not nearer the hole
 - (ii) avoids interference with the condition
 - (iii) is not in a hazard or on a putting green.
 - (b) drop the ball within one clublength of the point determined above.

The road across #12 is deemed to extend one club length beyond each side of the paved surface.

No relief may be taken when the ball lies on the grass strip between the cart path to the right of the 12th green and the cemetery fence. This area is defined by marked orange fence posts.

A COURTEOUS PLAYER WILL:

- (1) Allow faster players through
- (2) Rake sand traps after use
- (3) Replace divots & repair ball marks on greens
- (4) Keep carts off tees and away from green.
