



Sturgeon Point Golf Club A brief History

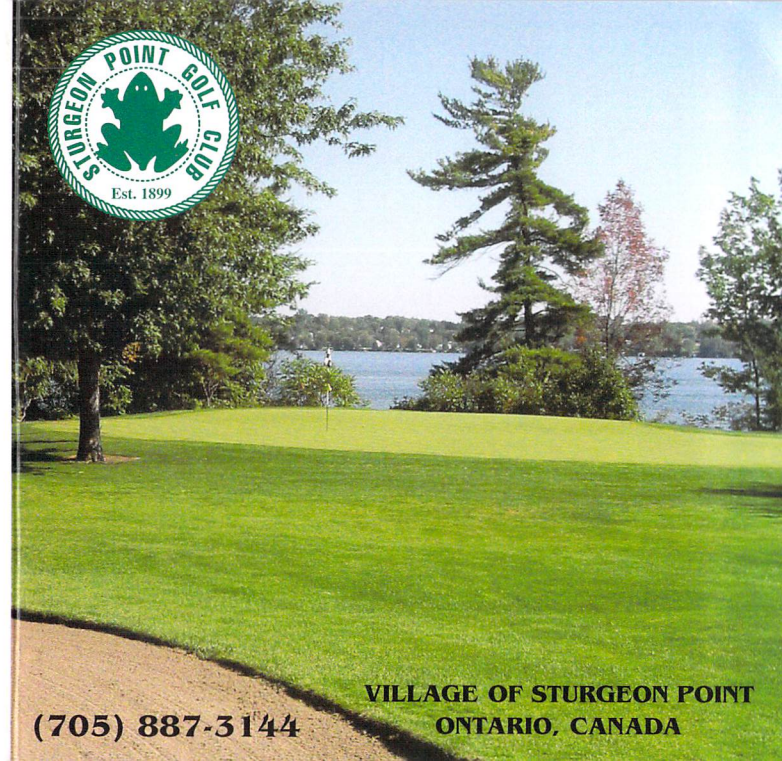
Golf has been played at Sturgeon Point since the 1890s. The course then was somewhat primitive with stone bunkers and fairways that looked like today's rough. At one point, the first tee was on what is now the Gray property across the road.

In the late 1920s, a group of Sturgeon Point residents decided to formalize the arrangement and in 1929 conveyed the land now known as the Sturgeon Point Golf Club to a group of five Trustees. The land was donated by Edith Flavelle, Sir Joseph Flavelle and Judge Gerald Holmes Hopkins.

The bylaws provided that the club would be managed by a board of 9 directors, a majority of whom should be inhabitants of the village of Sturgeon Point.

The Club has been fortunate over the years in having directors who are knowledgeable about golf and are dedicated to preserving and improving this remarkable facility.

This wonderful course has had some positive changes within the last few years to reflect today's standards.

LOCAL RULES

1. Protection of Young trees Identified by White Stake. If such a tree interferes with a player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the ball must be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b (Immovable Obstruction)
2. Power Lines. If a ball strikes the power line at the 5th or 6th hole the player must disregard that stroke, abandon the ball and play another ball as nearby as possible at the spot from which the original ball was – without penalty.

ETIQUETTE

1. Please keep electric carts at least twenty feet away from greens, sand traps and tee areas.
2. Maximum 4 players per group.
3. Please allow faster players to play through.
4. Proper attire to be worn at all times.
5. Each player must have his/her own clubs.
